Interior Preparation:

- **Clean Thoroughly:** Ensure all rooms are clean and dry to prevent mildew and pests¹.

- **Pantry and Refrigerator**: Remove perishables and donate or discard unused food items¹.
- Climate Control: Set the thermostat around 85 degrees to avoid mold and humidity damage².
- **Plumbing**: Turn off the main water supply and drain pipes to prevent leaks³.

- **Laundry**: Wash and store all linens and clothing in protective bags¹.
- **Furniture Protection**: Cover furniture to protect from dust and sunlight exposure¹.

Exterior Preparation:

- **Landscaping**: Remove all plants from balconies and porches.
- **Security Measures**: Check locks on doors and windows; consider a timed lighting system¹.
- Mail and Services: Forward mail and pause services like cable and internet³.
- **Pest Prevention**: Set up pest control measures to deter insects and rodents¹.

Final Checks:

- **Emergency Contact**: Leave a key and contact information with a trusted neighbor or property manager¹.
- **Insurance and Documents**: Ensure all insurance policies and important documents are up-to-date¹.
- **Visual Inspection**: Do a final walkthrough to check that all tasks are completed¹.
